The BBC's reputation is precious and it is critical that we maintain it by protecting our people from accusations of partiality in business dealings with third parties. For this reason all individuals who work for the BBC are required to declare all personal interests that may give rise to actual or potential conflicts of interest.

You should declare any outside or private interests or activities which could interfere with your BBC work, including private work, membership of voluntary organisations or statutory bodies. For example, if you are working as a researcher on documentary programmes that cover issues which relate to a voluntary organisation in which you are actively involved, it is possible that the impartiality of the BBC could be called into question. You may even be accused of fraud.

If you have doubts about whether to declare a particular interest, you should discuss the question with your manager.
