Jear Jr. Hanis,

Thank you for your letter of 17<sup>th</sup> August.

The most obvious guidance to the press in respect of disabled people is contained in Clause 12 (Discrimination) of the Code, which states: "the press must avoid prejudicial or pejorative reference to an individual's...physical or mental illness or disability" and "details of an individual's...physical or mental illness or disability must be avoided unless genuinely relevant to the story".

The use, therefore, of any expression to refer to a person's disability that might be reasonably considered to be prejudicial or pejorative would raise a breach of the Code and be proscribed by the PCC. For that reason, perhaps, the PCC has not found it necessary to produce a general list of terms, relating to disability as a whole, which are to be avoided by the press. I can certainly say that, in my experience, breaches of the Code in this respect are very rare indeed.

However, one area which has caused concern in the past related specifically to mental health. In 1997, as a result, the PCC published a guidance note (enclosed), which did indeed set down expressions to be avoided ("basket case" and "nutter", for example) as well as clarifying appropriate terminology to be used in describing people detained under the Mental Health Act 1983. We are in the process of assessing the impact of this note, but – anecdotally – it appears to have had a considerable effect in improving the reporting of mental health matters.
