I am writing in order to follow up our telephone conversation about the anniversary of the 7/7 Vivien Hepworth bombings.

As you know, the PCC was in contact with your department in the lead-up to the day, and ^{Adam Phillips} issued a note to editors, highlighting the families' wish to be allowed to grieve in private. We also sent – through the DCMS – copies of our literature that deals with possible harassment from the press, and includes contact details for the PCC's 24-hour emergency pager.

We have received no complaints, or contact on that pager, about newspaper behaviour on the DIRECTOR day. Indeed, it was notable that we received no complaints of harassment or intrusion after the bombings themselves last year.

I would be grateful if you could let me know whether there were any issues relating to press conduct that arose on the day of the anniversary. Any information would be useful for the PCC for future reference.


