During that process, Ruth kindly arranged for me to come to Broadmoor with her, during which we met the Patients' Council, patients, doctors and nurses. I found it a very useful visit indeed.

When I last spoke to Ruth before Christmas, we thought it would be extremely useful for me to pay a return visit seven years on - if you thought that appropriate - both to report back on what we have done to try to raise standards, and to hear views of how things have changed.

I am in the North West next week and will be visiting Ashworth: your perspective at some time in the spring or summer would be an added bonus to that.
