The Commission has, of course, taken note of what you said to the Select Committee. If you are able to submit any further material evidence to the PCC in regard to the involvement of News International employees in phone-message tapping, the Commission would welcome receipt of it.

The PCC is, as you know, considering whether it was misled by the paper in 2007 about the extent of the practice, and whether there is any evidence of phone-message tapping since 2007.

The Commission would consider any evidence you wish to submit in regard to either area.
