- How the PCC's Code of Practice can be used when dealing with journalists and editors
- What rights individuals from different groups have under the Code
- What people can expect from making a complaint to the PCC

Members of the public who would just like to come along and pick up some information about the PCC are very welcome to do so.

## 4pm onwards: Question and Answer session

Members of the public are invited to grill a panel of experts who have experience of the PCC about any aspect of the press or the system of self-regulation. The members of the panel will be:

- Sir Christopher Meyer, Chairman of the PCC and former Ambassador to the USA and Press Secretary to Prime Minister John Major
- Alison Hastings, BBC Trustee for England; and former editor of the Newcastle Evening Chronicle and PCC Commission member
- Tim Toulmin, Director of the PCC
- This will be an excellent opportunity for the public to share their views with senior representatives from the press industry, and we hope that people from all sections of the community will attend.
