

PCC issues Best Practice note on editorial co-operation with PCC

The PCC today publishes a Best Practice note on editorial co-operation with the Press Complaints Commission. It makes clear that:

- The Commission encourages newspapers and magazine to carry regular slots advertising the PCC's existence;
- Editors should make potential complainants aware of the PCC;
- Editors should not unnecessarily delay replies to the PCC during an investigation;
- Reference to the resolution of complaints should be tagged on a publication's records and the information made available as widely as possible.
